Alexander Tax Law Writing Competition hosted by the Federal Bar Association Section on Taxation and he was a recipient of the Milton Young Prize for excellence in the field of taxation at Fordham Law School. During law school, he participated in several legal internships and externships, including the civil and criminal division of the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of New York, the Securities and Exchange Commission Regional Office in New York, a judicial extern to Judge Joseph F. Bianco of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York and a judicial extern to the Honorable Margaret C. Reilly of the Surrogate's Court of Nassau County. He spent his fourth year of law school as a legal intern at Fordham's Low Income Taxpayer Clinic, assisting low income taxpayers with federal and New York state tax matters. During his last semester of law school, he participated in the New York Pro Bono Scholars Program.

Prior to law school and during law school, Michael worked at a Big Four and two midsized accounting firms in the real estate taxation industry. He received his Bachelor of Science in Accounting and Business Administration and Master of Science in Taxation, from the University at Albany, in 2009 and 2011 respectively.
