Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives, et al.*, a lawsuit challenging the federal government's regulation of untraceable "ghost guns," which have wrought havoc in communities nationwide. Liesel has worked extensively with the Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence, which awarded Gibson Dunn the Richard D. Ogers Pro Bono Partner Award in 2021.
