The Gibson Dunn IP Fellowship gives a select number of students who are committed to pursuing a career in IP litigation the opportunity to become fully embedded in our IP practice for ten weeks the summer after their second year in law school. Summer IP Fellows will take part in our regular summer program (attending thoughtful social events and substantive trainings) and will also enjoy direct mentoring from partners and associates in our IP Litigation group, participating in group gatherings and meeting our IP litigators across the U.S. In addition, they will execute assignments that contribute meaningfully to real-world representations, working primarily (or fully) on IP litigation matters. Eligibility

To be eligible for our Summer IP Fellowship, you must:

- Have obtained a technical degree, acquired significant credits, or demonstrated experience in engineering, computer science, physics, life sciences, or a similar field:
- 2. Have a demonstrated interest in pursuing a career in IP litigation and be excited about working primarily in that practice for the full summer program;
- Intend to practice law in a U.S. city in which Gibson Dunn has an office after graduating from law school; and
- Be currently enrolled in a full-time Juris Doctor program with an expected graduation date of spring 2026.

Selection Criteria

In selecting our Summer IP Fellows, Gibson Dunn will consider students':

- 1. Relevant technical- or IP-related employment, or clinical or extracurricular experience;
- 2. Scholastic achievement, both in law school and while pursuing an undergraduate degree;
- 3. Leadership qualities and ability to contribute to a team; and
- 4. Passion for practicing IP litigation.

Application Instructions

To apply, you must submit an application* through our <u>website</u>. Please refer to the application, selection, and interview timeline below. Complete applications must include:

- 1. Resume;
- 2. Unofficial or official transcripts for law school, and for undergraduate and any advanced degrees; and
- 3. Cover letter indicating the Gibson Dunn office where you are primarily interested in working and describing your demonstrated commitment to working in IP litigation, as well as any relevant background, experiences, or work experience that support your interest (maximum two pages double-spaced).

*Please note: If Gibson Dunn offers an early interview program for your school (in conjunction with a preview or resume collect program), please also apply for a Summer Associate position with us through that program. We plan on doing the majority of our hiring through those programs. Students interested in our Summer IP Fellowship may interview both through those programs and through the Fellowship selection process.

Timeline

Summer IP Fellowship applications accepted. Please submit complete applications with full 1L grades.

June 19 - July 1

Applications reviewed and interview invitations extended to selected students.

July 1 – July 12

Interviews with selected students. Please note that you may interview concurrently for a general Summer Associate position.

July 12 – August 5

Fellowship offers made and extended on a rolling basis.
